GENERAL INFORMATION

DISCIPLINE RULES

Please read all Rules and Notes for each discipline carefully. If you have any questions when entering, please check with the Discipline Co-Ordinator for the event.

Changes to the schedule and section details are made each year. The running of sections is dependent on sufficient entries received and are subject to change.

VENUE

Albury Entertainment Centre 525 Swift Street, Albury.

REGISTRATION & ENTRY

- 1. Entry fees are shown in the Entrant Notes for each discipline.
- 2. Entries close Friday 18 May 2018.
- 3. Enter online at Comps-Online:
 - Previous users of www.comps-online.com.au can login to their account and account information is retained, including your child/student details.
 - First time users, go to www.comps-online.com.au and click 'Register Now' to set up an account. You will be emailed a confirmation document that activates your account.
- 4. Online entry is the preferred method of entry. Manual entries can also be made by downloading an entry form from www.awesightandsound.com.au. A \$5.00 processing fee applies to manual entries. *Entry is not accepted or processed until payment is received by AWE.*
- 5. From 1 January 2017, music and sound recordings performed at the AWE are covered under a blanket licence scheme between AESA & rights management organisations; APRA AMCOS ARIA and PPCA. This licence is based on a per entry (performance) basis and has been incorporated into the entry fee.

PAYMENT

When entering via Comps-Online you will have the option to pay for your entries by **PayPal account or credit card.** When you have completed the online payment, you will be emailed an invoice confirming your entries. Please check your invoice carefully and report any errors immediately. If you do not receive an invoice within a few minutes, please contact admin@alburywodongaeisteddfod.com.au.

LATE ENTRY & CHANGES

LATE ENTRY

NO late entries will be accepted.

CHANGES TO AN ENTRY

A \$10.00 fee will be charged for any changes or adjustments to current entries. This includes changing the style of the performance, changing the age group, or any other changes that are a result of incorrect registration. This fee will not apply if Discipline Co-Ordinators have combined sections and offer alternative sections.

REFUND

Entry fees are not refundable except:

- a. If a section is cancelled
- b. If a Doctor's Certificate is supplied, and notification of withdrawal is received by the Discipline Co-Ordinator, prior to the day of performance.

CANCELLATION

Discipline Co-Ordinators may cancel sections if sufficient entries are not received. The section may be combined with another section or an alternative section may be offered.

WITHDRAWAL

Please advise the Discipline Co-Ordinator as soon as practicable if you do not intend, or are unable to perform (prior to the day of performance if possible) by email.

SCHEDULE

Once entries have closed, the Discipline Co-Ordinators will prepare the schedule and it will be uploaded to the AWE website. This will be updated, as required, to ensure the most current information is available to entrants.

PROGRAMME

A Programme will be available to purchase in advance and at the event. More information will be updated as it becomes available.

TICKETS

SEASON TICKETS

Season tickets will be available to purchase in advance and at the event. Adult season tickets are \$40.00 each and Concession \$25.00 (Senior, student, child). There are no restrictions on season tickets. Season Tickets are non-transferable.

ONLINE TICKETS

From 2018, tickets for all AWE sessions will be available to pre-purchase online via the 123Tix website. The link for online ticketing is <u>123Tix AWE tickets</u> and will be active once scheduling is complete.

All entrants will receive an email to advise tickets are on sale. Tickets sales will also be advertised on the AWE Facebook page @aweisteddfod and on the AWE website www.awesightandsound.com.au.

DOOR SALES

All tickets will be available to purchase from the venue on the day, subject to availability. To avoid disappointment, it is recommended to purchase tickets online, especially for the popular sessions.

More information will be updated as it becomes available.

PRIZES

Prizes may consist of trophies, medals, certificates, ribbons or cash vouchers and will be awarded to the winner of each section, determined by the AWE Committee and the Discipline Co-Ordinator based on the number of entries received.

PERPETUAL TROPHIES

Some sections have a Perpetual Trophy for the winner's prize. Perpetual trophies from the previous year must be returned engraved (at the **winner's** expense), in a clean condition to the Discipline Co-Ordinator by 1 July 2018. Failure to do so will result in the cost of replacement being invoiced to the trophy holder.



RULES OF THE EISTEDDFOD

GENERAL RULES

These rules are to facilitate the administration and logistics required to convene several hundred events in the Albury Wodonga Eisteddfod. Please read the rules in association with Entrant Notes provided in each discipline.

Please read carefully as the rules have been updated.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1. Entrants perform at their own risk.
- 2. Entrants must be prepared to provide proof of age.
- 3. Entrants are entitled to their performance opportunity and adjudication/critique. No entrant will be "disqualified" (excludes Highland Dance).
- 4. Entrants may enter only once within a designated section, unless stated elsewhere.
- 5. Entrants must perform at the time allocated in the programme.
- 6. Entrants must not present the same piece or dance more than once in the Eisteddfod, unless invited to participate in a special concert or display.
- 7. No person, including teachers and parents, will accompany entrants onto the platform/stage except as an Accompanist or Conductor.
- 8. By entering the Albury Wodonga Eisteddfod, the entrant gives permission for the AWE to use photographs, video and/or their name for promotional and/or marketing purposes. If the entrant does NOT agree, it is the entrant's responsibility to notify the AWE in writing.
- 9. By entering the Albury Wodonga Eisteddfod, the entrant agrees to abide by the General Rules and Code of Conduct as listed by the Albury Wodonga Eisteddfod Committee, in this publication, along with rules and conditions specific to the Discipline section entered
- 10. The AWE reserves the right to:
 - a. amend or refuse any entry,
 - b. deny participation,
 - c. alter or reduce the prizes as published,
 - d. amend, cancel or combine any event,
 - e. vary any rule where such variation is deemed necessary.

PHOTOGRAPHY & USE OF ELECTRONIC DEVICES

- 11. The AWE is the only authorised body, or its representative, to take photographs or videos during performances due to copyright restrictions and privacy legislation. The exception may be parents or teachers of HSC/VCE/VET competitors.
- 12. Personal electronic devices must be switched off whilst in the performing venue. This includes but is not limited to: mobile phones, iPads/tablets, e-readers, iPods, cameras, video cameras, Nintendo DS, personal computers. The use of these devices by members of the audience during competitions is strictly prohibited. Offenders will be asked to leave the venue.

ADJUDICATOR

- 13. The decision of an Adjudicator is final, no discussion or correspondence is permitted.
- 14. NO COMMUNICATION WITH THE ADJUDICATOR by entrants, teachers or family members. Following a breach of this rule, or any other, the entrant may become ineligible for a placement.
- 15. Medals and other special awards will only be made where performance standards satisfy the Adjudicator.

COPYRIGHT

- 16. In accordance with the 2006 Copyright Amendment Act and APRA guidelines, entrants must comply with copyright legislation. The AWE accepts no liability for copyright infringement by entrants.
- 17. No photography or videography is permitted during performances.
- 18. From 1 January 2017, music and sound recordings performed at the AWE is covered under a blanket licence scheme between AESA & rights management organisations; APRA AMCOS ARIA and PPCA. This licence is based on a per entry (performance) basis and has been incorporated into the entry fee.

COMPETITOR PASS

20. Each entrant will be eligible for a competitor pass, allowing entry into the venue, subject to availability.

VENUE REQUIRMENTS

- 20. All electrical appliances MUST be tested & tagged.
- 21. Prams and/or baby strollers are not permitted in the Main Theatre.
- 22. Smoking is not permitted within four (4) metres of entrances and exits to the venue.

CODE OF CONDUCT

This applies to all who attend the Eisteddfod.

ENTRANTS

Standard of dress applies to all entrants and must be appropriate for the occasion.

Inappropriate costuming, lyrics or choreography may result in the entrant being ineligible for a placement in that section.

All costumes must be covered when in the theatre audience.

THEATRE ETIQUETTE

No yelling, whistling etc., before, during or after performances.

No entry or exit to the theatre is permitted when performers are on stage.

Entry and Exit from the auditorium is only permitted when an entrant is NOT on stage.

Further restrictions may be enforced during the event.

STANDARD OF BEHAVIOUR

The Albury Wodonga Eisteddfod promotes fair and friendly competition and a high standard of behaviour from students, entrants, teachers, parents and spectators is expected.

INAPPROPRIATE BEHAVIOUR

Inappropriate behaviour towards Volunteers, Committee Members, Venue Staff, Entrants. Audience Members or others will not be tolerated.

SOCIAL MEDIA

Defamation of character on social media towards any person involved in the Albury Wodonga Eisteddfod will not be tolerated.

BREACH OF RULES

Offenders found breaching the Code of Conduct will be asked to leave the venue.

COMPLAINTS

- Complaints made must be in writing. The complaint must include the complainant's full name and address, and be lodged with the Discipline Co-Ordinator within 48 hours of the event. Such a complaint must be accompanied by a fee of \$20.00, which is refundable if the protest is upheld.
- 2. The Committee shall be the sole judge of disputes and its decision shall be final.

HIGHLAND DANCE (as per NSWSCHDI)

- 1. Any complaint made by an individual against the Albury Wodonga Eisteddfod Ltd or Adjudication of any event must be made in writing, giving the complainant's full name and address, and shall be lodged with the Discipline Co-Ordinator, if possible on the day of the event, and certainly not later than 48 hours after the event. Such complaint is to be accompanied by a fee of \$5.00 that is refundable if the protest is upheld.
- 2. If the complainant has not received satisfaction from the Discipline Co-Ordinator within seven days, the complaint may be referred to the Honorary Secretary, State Committee of Highland Dance Inc.

DANCE RULES

Please read carefully as there are changes to conditions and rules.

1.0 STAGE USE

- 1.1 No special lighting effects are allowed.
- 1.2 No glitter or confetti is to be dispersed on stage or into audience due to safety and theatre regulations.
- 1.3 The curtain will remain up during the event.
- 1.4 No assistance by any other person/s is to be given to entrants once they have entered the stage.
- 1.5 If an entrant leaves the stage and does not complete their performance, they will not be placed and will only receive a Critique.

2.0 AGE CATEGORIES

- 2.1 Entrants may dance in an age section higher to their own, but may not dance in a younger age section.
- 2.2 If insufficient entries are received for a section, entrants will be notified and may choose to dance in a higher age group.

3.0 NOVICE

- 3.1 Entrants who have NOT achieved 1st or 2nd place in a specific section at any eisteddfod or competition, prior to 18 May 2018.
- 3.2 Entrants who enter a specific Novice Solo section (style) are not permitted to enter the same specific Open Solo section in their own age group.

4.0 **OPEN**

4.1 Entrants who have achieved 1st or 2nd place in a specific section at any eisteddfod or competition, prior to 18 May 2018.

5.0 DUO / TRIO / QUAD

5.1 Entrants may appear once only in any section.

6.0 TROUPE

- 6.1 Minimum of 5 members.
- 6.2 Full troupe must perform dance work for a minimum of two (2) minutes.
- 6.3 Entrants may appear more than once in any troupe section.
- 6.4 All entries must be accompanied by a list showing names and Date of Birth of each member.

7.0 PROFESSIONAL

7.1 Entrant who derives majority of their income from performing or teaching in the dance industry.

8.0 DANCE STUDENT (Still in training)

8.1 Entrants who teach on a casual or part-time basis are permitted to enter sections based on their age and experience.

9.0 NO REPEATS

9.1 Any routine performed in one section may not be repeated in any another section. (Includes Scholarship & Championship sections).

10.0 TIME LIMIT

- 10.1 Time limits must be strictly adhered to.
- 10.2 Adjudication will cease when time limit is reached.
- 10.3 Time commences:

If entrant starts on stage – when music begins If entrant starts off stage - Upon entering stage

10.4 Maximum time permitted:

3 minutes
4 minutes
3 minutes
4 minutes
5 minutes
3 minutes
3 minutes
3 minutes

12.0 MUSIC

- 12.1 Entrants are responsible for their own music.
- Music must be handed to the backstage sound desk prior to commencement of the section.
- Music must be provided in the following format (or music quality cannot be assured):
- 12.3.1 New CD, no scratches.
- 12.3.2 Do NOT use CD-RW discs.
- 12.3.3 Burned at 4, 8 or 12 times maximum speed.
- 12.3.4 One (1) track per CD.
- 12.3.5 Mark the CD with the entrant's name; section number and "on" or "off" stage (for starting) in permanent marker (no labels).
- 12.3.6 Check it has successfully burned, not on computer or car audio system.
- 12.3.7. Bring a back up in case of technical difficulties.

13.0 SECTION REQUIREMENTS

13.1 MUSICAL

- 13.1.1 Music must be selected from a major live musical production E.g. Chicago, Les Misérables, Cats etc., Copyright permission will be required to be sighted.
- 13.1.2 Singing & lip syncing are permitted.

13.2 NURSERY RHYME

13.2.1 Must depict the storyline of a Nursery Rhyme.

13.3 SONG & DANCE

13.3.1 Can be performed with or without taps. No recorded vocals or tapping permitted for the whole routine in song and dance section.

13.4 HSC / VCE / VET

- 13.4.1 Entrant chooses own music and style of dance according to HSC/VCE/VET criteria. Adjudication in this section will not necessarily be based on HSC/VCE/VET criteria, but on performance and technical ability.
- 13.4.2 Must be entirely student's own work.
- 13.4.3 No aggregate points awarded for this section.

14.0 CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 14.0.1 To be eligible for entry in the Championship sections, entrants must enter in Open Solo sections for their relevant age group in the chosen genre.
- 14.0.2 Additional entry fee applies.
- 14.0.3 Championship is not offered in 6 Years & Under section.
- 14.0.4 Entrants are required to perform the two (2) dances for each Championship as listed below (excluding Tap):

14.1 <u>CLASSICAL BALLET</u> CHAMPIONSHIP

- 14.1.2 The following dances must be performed:
- 14.1.3 Classical*
- 14.1.4 Demi Character
- 14.1.5 * Tutu must be worn in all classical solos.
- 14.2 JAZZ CHAMPIONSHIP
- 14.2.1 A choice of one of each from following:
- 14.2.2 Slow **or** Fast Jazz
- 14.2.3 Hip Hop / Funk **or** Musical
- 14.3 MODERN CHAMPIONSHIP
- 14.3.1 The following must be performed:
- 14.3.2 Lyrical
- 14.3.3 Contemporary
- 14.4 TAP CHAMPIONSHIP
- 14.4.1 The following must be performed:
- 14.4.2 Slow and Fast Tap without leaving the stage

15.0 ALBURY WODONGA CLASSICAL CUP - 13 Years & Over

- 15.1 Entrants must perform in the Open Classical and Demi Character Solo sections of their age group to qualify for entry in to this section.
- 15.2 Perform from Repertoire/Variation List (refer Attachment 1-pages 16-17).
- 15.3 Additional entry fee payable.

16.0 SCHOLARSHIPS

- 16.0.1 All entrants who compete in the sections required for Scholarships, are encouraged to participate. A classical background is not necessary.
- 16.0.2 These sections are chosen to ensure that students can think on their feet, demonstrate an understanding of music and movement, perform choreography as directed and work with others.
- 16.0.3 To be eligible, entrants must enter and compete in the following Solo sections in their age group below:
- 16.0.4 Three (3) different dance genres must be nominated for Junior Scholarship (four (4) for Senior Scholarship). These must be nominated at time of entry.
- 16.0.5 Entrants who do not perform the discipline as nominated will become ineligible to win the Scholarship.
- 16.0.6 Additional entry fee payable.

16.1 JUNIOR SCHOLARSHIP (12 YEARS & UNDER):

- 16.1.1 Improvisation Solo
- 16.1.2 Own Choreography Solo
- 16.1.3 Entrant's Choice Solo-entrant to nominate chosen section.
 - Note: To maximise your Scholarship points, enter your strongest solo section.
- 16.1.4 Masterclass with Adjudicator.

16.2 SENIOR SCHOLARSHIP (13 YEARS & OVER):

- 16.2.1 Improvisation Solo
- 16.2.2 Own Choreography Solo
- 16.2.3 Any Style Solo Entrant to nominate chosen section
- 16.2.4 Entrant's Choice Solo Entrant to nominate chosen section.

 Note: To maximise your Scholarship points, enter your strongest solo section.
- 16.2.5 Masterclass with Adjudicator.

17.0 AGE AGGREGATES:

- 17.1 Awarded to entrants with the highest points accumulated in the following sections: Classical, Contemporary, Demi Character, Hip Hop/Funk, Jazz, Lyrical, National, Neo Classical, Song & Dance, and Tap.
- 17.2 Championship and Scholarship sections do not count towards the Age Aggregate.

18.0 MASTERCLASS

18.1 All ages and all technique levels. This is an opportunity for dancers of all ages and skill levels to learn and enjoy a Masterclass with our professional Adjudicator.

19.0 PERFORMANCE ATTIRE

19.1 CLASSICAL IMPROVISATION

Plain black leotard, pink tights, ballet shoes and half tutu optional. 12 Years & Under NO pointe shoes allowed.

- 19.2 JAZZ IMPROVISATION
 - Plain black leotard, black boy leg shorts, skin coloured tights and jazz shoes.
- 19.3 NEO CLASSICAL IMPROVISATION

Plain black leotard, pink tights, pink ballet shoes and ballet skirt optional. 12 years & under NO pointe shoes allowed.

19.4 HIP HOP/FUNK IMPROVISATION

Plain black leotard or black t-shirt, black boy leg shorts or black pants and jazz or funk shoes.

19.5 TAP IMPROVISATION

Plain black leotard, skin coloured tights and tap shoes.

19.6 MASTERCLASS

Dress attire for class is a plain black leotard or unitard, tights, ballet shoes & hair in a bun.

(NO pointe shoes, wrap skirts, warm up gear or hair pieces).

OWN CHOREOGRAPHY

- 182. Small Group 2 5 dancers
- 1. A group choreography competition is open to registered dancers, the age groups to be set by the organiser.
- 2. Content should consist primarily of movements from Highland, National, Hornpipe and Jig books.
- 3. Maximum five (5) minutes time limit to include entrance and exit of competitors and setting up and removal of props.
- 4. Teams may use props during their performance, either static or non-static, but live animals are not permitted.
- 5. A minimum of two (2) and a maximum of five (5) dancers.
- 6. Music may be live or pre-recorded and may include vocal or percussion selections, but must be predominantly Scottish or Celtic in style.
- 7. Music may be provided by the competition organiser.
- 8. Costumes must follow the theme and content.
- 9. No separate prizes for costumes etc.
- 10. Teams should consist of:
- 10.1 One (1) school only;
- 10.2 More than one (1) school, in which case, the teacher/choreographer must abide by the three (3) month teaching/judging rule.

MUSIC RULES

Please read carefully as rules have changed.

1.0 GENERAL

- 1.1 Open Age refers to any age.
- 1.2 Attire should match the expectations of the adjudicator and the occasion. Concert attire or school uniform is suitable.

2.0 TIME LIMIT

- 2.1 Time limits must be strictly adhered to.
- 2.2 Adjudication will cease when the time limit is reached. Should a time limit be exceeded, item may be terminated or abbreviated by the Adjudicator without prejudice to the performers. Repeats in instrumental sections should be avoided.

3.0 COPYRIGHT

3.1 SHEET MUSIC

- 3.1.1 In accordance with Copyright Law, ALL entrants must use legal or original sheet music in their performance (unless playing by ear).
- 3.1.2 ALL entrants must provide a copy of the sheet music for the Adjudicator and the Accompanist, if applicable (vocal entrants must include full score including lyrics), in addition to the performance copy.
- 3.1.3 Entrants must include the music for the accompaniment, if applicable.
- 3.1.4 To meet copyright obligations, a Copyright Declaration Form will need to be downloaded and completed, if a photocopy of original/legal sheet music is used to:
- 3.1.4.1 Provide the Adjudicator and/or the Accompanist;
- 3.1.4.2 Or for ease of performance (eg multiple pages joined together to form one sheet);
- 3.1.4.3 The Copyright Declaration Form (<u>download CDF here</u>) permits the use of a temporary copy of the sheet music to provide the Adjudicator and/or Accompanist, for the Eisteddfod. Photocopies MUST be destroyed after the event.
- 3.1.4.4 The CDF form needs to be attached to any photocopies and submitted to the Registration Desk, a minimum of 15 minutes before the section is due to commence.

4.0 NO REPEATS

4.1 Any piece performed in one section may not be repeated in any another section. (Includes Championship sections).

5.0 ACCOMPANIMENT

- 5.1 Entrants are responsible for their own music and the associated costs.
- 5.1.1 Piano, keyboard or other instrument are permitted as an instrumental accompaniment.
- 5.1.2 Albury Wodonga Eisteddfod does not provide Accompanists.
- 5.1.3 If you require an Accompanist, you may consider the Murray Conservatorium. More information can be found on the AWE Website.

5.2 RECORDED ACCOMPANIMENT (CD)

- 5.2.1 Recorded accompaniment must be provided on a CD.
- 5.2.2 Music must be handed to the Registration Desk a minimum of 15 minutes prior to commencement of the section.
- 5.2.3 Music must be provided in the following format (or music quality cannot be assured):
- 5.2.3.1 New CD, free from scratches.
- 5.2.3.2 Do NOT use CD-RW disc.
- 5.2.3.3 Burned at 4, 8 or 12 times maximum speed.
- 5.2.3.4 One (1) piece per CD.
- 5.2.3.5 Mark entrant's name; section number in permanent marker on the CD (no labels).
- 5.2.3.6 Check it has successfully burned, not on computer or car audio system.
- 5.2.3.7 Bring a backup in case of technical problems.

6.0 SOLO INSTRUMENTAL

- 6.1.1 One (1) piece without repeats, unless very short for each section.
- 6.2 Extended works not to be performed.
- 6.3 For 13 and 14 Years and older age groups, the Baroque/Classical/Romantic section requires two (2) styles to be chosen and played, contrasting pieces are suggested.
- 6.3.1 Only one (1) solo entry fee is payable for the Baroque/Classical/Romantic section.
- 6.4 Recorder to enter in Solo Woodwind sections.
- 6.5 Saxophone to enter in Solo Woodwind sections.
- 6.6 Piano, keyboard or other instrument accompaniment permitted, if desired.

7.0 CHOPIN PIANO SOLO CHALLENGE

- 7.01 A minimum of three (3) entrants required per section.
- 7.1 14 Years and Under:
- 7.1.1 One (1) piece to be selected from the following:

Mazurka

Nocturne

Prelude

Waltz.

- 7.2 15 Years and Over:
- 7.2.1 Any two (2) works by Chopin.

8.0 RUTH WHYTE MEMORIAL BEQUEST (RWMB)

- 8.1 To be eligible for entry, entrants must be:
- 8.1.1 Aged 15 years and over;
- 8.1.2 Have a minimum AMEB Grade 6 level (or equivalent).
- 8.2 First prize only awarded in each section (cash prize):
- 8.2.1 Solo Orchestral Instrumental-Strings (excluding Guitar)
- 8.2.2 Solo Orchestral Instrumental Woodwind
- 8.2.3 Solo Orchestral Instrumental Brass
- 8.3 Two (2) pieces to be played:
- 8.3.1 one (1) Pre-1900 and
- 8.3.2 one (1) Post-1900
- 8.3.3 Examples of suitable works will be published on the Albury Wodonga Eisteddfod website. Entrants are not required to choose from this list.
- 8.4 Three (3) points to be considered in adjudication:
- 8.4.1 Technical ability;
- 8.4.2 Musical interpretation;
- 8.4.3 Personal expression.
- 8.5 Name of instrument to be included on entry.
- 8.6 A minimum of 3 entrants is required per section.
- 8.7 Adjudicator reserves the right to not award a winner if a suitable standard is not met.
- 8.8 Entry fee: \$20.00

9.0 INSTRUMENTAL DUET

- 9.1 Age group is per the older entrant.
- 9.2 An entrant may only enter in one (1) Instrumental Duet section per age group.
- 9.3 One (1) piece to be played, any style or period.
- 9.4 Any instruments or same instruments.
- 9.5 Specify instruments on entry.

- 9.6 Siblings may enter Duet Section and/or Sibling Duet/Trio/Quartet Section.
- 9.7 Piano Duet (enter section 1200–1201).

10.0 SIBLING DUET/TRIO/QUARTET

- 10.1 Age group is per the older entrant.
- 10.2 An entrant may only enter in one (1) Instrumental Duet section per age group.
- 10.3 One (1) piece to be played, any style or period.
- 10.4 Any instruments or same instruments.
- 10.5 Specify instruments on entry.
- 10.6 No repeats.
- 10.7 Siblings may enter Duet section and/or Sibling Duet/Trio/Quartet section.

11.0 INSTRUMENTAL ENSEMBLES (3-10 MEMBERS)

- 11.1 Age group is per the oldest entrant.
- 11.2 Two (2) contrasting pieces.
- 11.3 No conductor permitted.
- 11.4 No vocals.
- 11.5 Ukulele accepted in Instrumental Ensemble sections.
- 11.6 See Vocal for combined Vocal/Instrumental sections.

12.0 VOCAL SECTIONS

- 12.1 One (1) song for each section.
- 12.2 A maximum of three (3) verses should be sung where these are melodically the same.
- 12.3 Song/lyrics submitted to the Adjudicator must have the full musical score not just chords.
 - Note: Ensure you comply with Copyright Rules.
- 12.4 Suitable expression, emotion, and gesture may be used.
- 12.4.1 No acting, costumes or props allowed (except in Character Song with Costume section).
- 12.5 Entrants to provide own instrumental accompaniment.
- 12.5.1 No vocals permitted on recorded accompaniment.

13.0 SONG DEFINITIONS

13.1 CLASSICAL SONG

are Classical style songs including 20th/21st century, as distinguished from Folk, Popular or Jazz.

13.2 TRADITIONAL / FOLK SONG

are Traditional songs, from any country, with no known composer. They may be sung the language of the country of origin, with or without accompaniment.

13.3 AUSTRALIAN SONG

in

Composed/performed by an Australian composer or artist.

13.4 SACRED SONG / GOSPEL

a hymn or carol, which is defined as a piece of music occurring in a collection of hymns or carols designed for congregational singing.

13.5 CHARACTER SONG IN COSTUME

From a musical stage production or film sung in the original form. To be performed in costume. Stage props and dance not permitted.

13.6 POPULAR SONG

are songs, including jazz songs, which have been widely circulated and promoted.

13.7 A CAPELLA

Any song performed in the style of A Capella.

13.8 OPERA - From a traditional opera sung in the operatic style.

14.0 VOCAL DUET/TRIO/QUARTET

- 14.1 Age group is per the eldest entrant.
- 14.2 One (1) song, any style.
- 14.3 Accompanist allowed.
- 14.4 An entrant may only enter one (1) DUET/TRIO/QUARTET section per age group.

15.0 OWN COMPOSITION - INSTRUMENTAL OR VOCAL

- 15.1 Entrants will be required to perform their own composition.
- 15.2 A copy of the composition should be forwarded to "AWE Music Entry-Own Composition" by email to: music@alburywodongaeisteddfod.com.au by 1 August 2018.

16.0 SOLO ARTIST CHALLENGE *NEW*

- 16.1 Open Age.
- 16.2 Solo vocal or instrumental interpretation of a known musical/vocal piece.
- 16.3 Accompaniment permitted.
- 16.3.1 If using recorded accompaniment, instrumental only.
- 16.4 2018 Solo Artist and Song: George Michael, Freedom! '90

17.0 AGGREGATES

- 17.1 Two (2) age aggregates may be awarded per age group, vocal and instrumental.
- 17.2 Entrants must perform in a minimum of three (3) solo items in their age group in any discipline.
- 17.3 Awarded in the following age groups:
 - 8 Years & Under
 - 9 & 10 Years
 - 11 & 12 Years
 - 13 & 14 Years
 - 15 & 16 Years
 - 17 & 18 Years
 - 18 Years & Over
- 17.4 The aggregate score is the total of the entrant's three (3) highest adjudication marks.
- 17.5 In the event of a tie, entrants next highest score will be considered in deciding the winner.
- 17.6 Section 1299 does not count towards Age Aggregates.
- 17.7 Duet/Trio/Quartet, Championship, RWMB, Solo Artist and Chopin Piano Challenge sections do not count towards Age Aggregate.

18.0 CHAMPIONSHIP SECTIONS

- 18.01 Championship sections are individual sections.
- 18.02 A minimum of three (3) entrants required per section.
- 18.03 Entrants must enter a minimum of three (3) solo sections in their age group plus Masterclass to be eligible.
- 18.04 Two (2) pieces to be performed in the following styles:
- 18.04.1 Australian Composer or Artist
- 18.04.2 Own Choice
- 18.05 Items performed during the solo sections of this Eisteddfod MUST not be repeated in Championship.
- 18.06 Entry fee is \$25.00 and includes the Masterclass.

18.1 INSTRUMENTAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

18.1.1 Championship level is based upon individual entrant's ability, AMEB (or equivalent) grade is EXPECTED (evidence of grade level may be requested but not required).

18.2 VOCAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

18.2.1 Championship level is based on entrant's age.

19.0 MASTERCLASS

- 19.1 Education session with the Adjudicator, open to all entrants. This is an opportunity for musicians and vocalists of all ages and skill levels to learn and enjoy a Masterclass with our professional Adjudicator. All entrants are encouraged to attend this workshop.
- 19.2 A Junior (13 Years and Under) and Senior (Over 13 Years) Masterclass will be scheduled if sufficient entries are received.
- 19.3 This is a closed session.
- 19.4 Topics covered will be at the discretion of the Adjudicator.
- 19.5 Entry fee is \$10.00.

20.0 SCHOOLS

- 20.0.1 Year refer to school class year groups.
- 20.0.2 All members are to be students of the school, no adults are to perform with the ensemble, orchestra or band.
- 20.0.3 Please supply your own equipment and music stands.
- 20.0.4 Two (2) teacher passes will be issued per school. All other helpers/volunteers must pay the entry fee into the venue.
- 20.0.5 Estimated number of students to be included on entry.

21.0 SCHOOL ENSEMBLE/BAND

- 21.1 Ensembles, Orchestras and Bands must have a minimum of five (5) instruments.
- 21.2 Specify type e.g. string band, brass band or marimba percussion band.
- 21.3 Two (2) contrasting pieces or medley permitted. Any style or period.
- 21.3.1 The following sections are only required to play one piece or medley: 1350, 1361.
- 21.4 Conductor permitted.
- 21.5 Ensembles with less than five (5) instruments may enter the General Ensemble section in the appropriate age group (sections 1206-1210).
- 21.5.1 Bands with vocalists (any genre, excluding Rock) to enter sections 1361-1365 (Primary) or sections 1376-1379 (Secondary).
- 21.5.2 Rock bands are to enter sections 1380-1382.

22.0 SCHOOL ROCK BANDS

- 22.1. May be 4 or 5 piece band.
- 22.2 Two (2) contrasting pieces or medley permitted.
- 22.3 A ten (10) minute sound check will be allocated prior to the commencement of the section.

23.0 SCHOOL VOCAL GROUPS AND CHOIRS

- 23.1 Two (2) songs of contrasting style or mood.
- 23.2 Conductor permitted.
- 23.3 Accompanist is optional.
- 23.3.1 Piano will be available.
- 23.3.2 Recorded Accompaniment permitted (instrumental only).

24.0 SPECIAL SCHOOLS

Open to entrants with particular requirements resulting from learning difficulties, physical disability, or emotional and behavioural difficulties.

25.0 SCHOOL A CAPELLA GROUP

25.1 Two (2) songs of contrasting style or mood.

26.0 COMMUNITY ENSEMBLE/BAND (WITH VOCALS)

- 26.1 Open Age.
- 26.2 Contrasted music involving both singer and instrumental players.
- 26.3 Any combination of instruments and voices.
- 26.4 Conductor permitted.
- 26.5 Any number of group members.
- 26.6 Includes Family Groups.
- 26.7 Rock Bands to enter section1428-1430.
- 26.8 Please supply your own equipment and music stands.
- 26.9 Please supply estimated number of members on entry.

27.0 COMMUNITY ENSEMBLE/BAND (NO VOCALS)

- 27.1 Open Age.
- 27.2 Two (2) songs of contrasting style or mood.
- 27.3 Conductor permitted.
- 27.4 Any number of group members.
- 27.5 Includes Family Groups.
- 27.6 Rock Bands to enter sections 1428-1430.
- 27.7 Please supply your own equipment and music stands.
- 27.8 Please supply estimated number of members on entry.

28.0 COMMUNITY ROCK BANDS

- 28.1 Open Age.
- 28.2 May be 4 or 5 piece band.

SPEECH AND DRAMA RULES

Please read all rules carefully as some rules have changed.

- 1. All items other than set pieces are entrant's own choice. Own choice pieces and plays are expected to be of a high literary standard and not contain any coarse, obscene or offensive language or references. If this does occur, entrants become ineligible for an award, but are still entitled to their adjudication.
- 2. Set Pieces Scripture Reading and Choral Speaking are available from Speech & Drama Co-Ordinator, Jan Skinner.
- 3. Copies of all selections typed, properly punctuated and marked "NOT SUBJECT TO COPYRIGHT" must be handed in to Speech & Drama Co-ordinator, Jan Skinner, by Saturday 7 July 2018. Prepared readings need not be submitted.
- 4. No entrant is permitted to perform the same item they have previously performed at an AWE Eisteddfod.
- 5. **Choral Speaking Choir** members may perform in only one choir in the same section. No curtains will be used for the choirs entering or exiting the stage.
- 6. **Scripture Readings** are taken from the King James Bible. Entrants are to supply their own Bible & read directly from it.
- 7. In all Improvisation Sections, a warning bell will be given one (1) minute prior to the concluding time.
- 8. Maximum time limits are stated beside each event. In all Intermediate, Senior and Open Sections, time limits are enforced. A bell will ring when the time limit is reached,

and entrants must finish at the end of the current sentence. Entrants who do not finish on the bell become ineligible for an award, but are still entitled to their adjudication. The bell rule will not be used for any Junior Sections; however, selections should not exceed three (3) minutes.

- 9. **One Act Plays, Unscripted Play Building and Group Improvisation** Entrants may only appear once in one age group per section.
- 10. Costumes and props are only permitted in Character Recitals, Duologues, Unscripted Play-building, and One Act Plays. A single chair may be used in other sections if required, however no costumes (or part thereof) or props are permitted in any individual sections.
- 11. No Copies of a script or part of a script are allowed on stage in any section. They may not be included as part of props, sets or costumes.
- 12. If there is only one (1) entrant in any Individual Section, the section will be deleted or amalgamated with the next age group, where possible. This rule does **not** apply to Group Sections or 6 Years and Under Sections.
- 13. **Championship Recital** must contain a minimum of four (4) entrants competing on the day for the section to proceed. If, however, an entrant is sick on the day and unable to compete and a Doctor's Certificate is submitted, the section will go ahead.

AGGREGATE CHAMPIONSHIP RULES

Aggregate Trophies must be returned engraved, to either the Speech & Drama Co-Ordinator or Teacher by Saturday 23 June 2018.

- 1. In **ALL** following Junior Aggregate sections:
 - a. Entrants must perform in four (4) individual sections of the Speech and Drama Syllabus.
 - b. An aggregate is taken of the best three (3) placings (two (2) of which must be recitals) earned in sections 01 to 06.

SUB - JUNIORETTE 6 Years & Under JUNIORETTE 8 Years & Under SUB - JUNIOR 10 Years & Under JUNIOR 12 Years & Under

- c. Two (2) of the performances must be Recitals.
- 2. In **ALL** following Aggregate sections:
 - a. Entrants must perform in five (5) individual sections of the Speech and Drama Syllabus.
 - b. An aggregate will be determined by taking the best four (4) placings (three (3) of which must be recitals) earned in sections 01 to 07 for the relevant ages.

INTERMEDIATE 13 & 14 Years SENIOR 15 & 16 Years OPEN

c. **Three** (3) of the performances must be Recitals.

DEFINITIONS

1. Championship Recital

Entrants must undertake both sections, Lyrical Recital and Selection from a Play, and must introduce and link their pieces to demonstrate a theme. Time limit for this section is a minimum five (5) minutes, maximum eight (8) minutes, including links.

2. Choral Speaking

Choirs will be required to present the Set Piece and another of their own choosing that contrasts with the Set Piece. Stands are not provided but may be used.

3. Story Telling

Entrants will be given either an object to base their story around; the beginning of a sentence which they must use to begin their story; or a theme which they use to create their story. This is the Adjudicator's choice.

4. Unscripted Play-Building

This section is as the title suggests – the performance is to be unscripted. The entrants create a theme and workshop it in class, under the supervision of the teacher, and then present it as a play performance. There is to be NO SCRIPT at all, not even if the students have written it, as this makes it a scripted play. (This also allows the entrants to rearrange their parts and dialogue if, in the unfortunate event, someone is absent for the performance). As it is play building, dialogue must take up 95% of the performance. Any entrant known to have a written script will not be marked and therefore ineligible for an award.

5. One Act Plays

Minimum number of entrants is three (3). Five (5) minutes is allowed for set up and five (5) minutes to strike the stage. Marks will be awarded for literary value. No curtain calls are permitted.

6. **Prepared Reading**

Must be read directly from the original book.

7. Light or Humorous Recital

May be a monologue selection.

8. Own Choice Selection

Junior (12 years and under) through to Open Sections must NOT be Humorous Recitals.
